

Notes on Wood Families PA / MD / DE - NC

In May, 2018, to answer some questions about Wood families who settled in Orange County, North Carolina in the 1750's or so, I went through my **Woods and Wood** files of early county record transcriptions / abstracts made from various publications, on-line sources, or sent to me by mail from such things as ye olde "Group Sheet Exchange" and compiled them into the collection below.

First people, should know there were roughly two main groups of settlers in Orange County, North Carolina. One bunch came

in during the French and Indian War from Virginia, when Loudon demanned the 20 Forts that George Washington had built, resulting in them being overrun and those not killed outright either being massacred or taken prisoner by the Native allies of the French. After this, there was no protection for the Virginia counties in the Shenandoah valley and foothills of the Appalachians immediately westward. Tens of thousands of Virginians fled the area, and many went to North Carolina, whose governor was inviting them and having multiple agents new deeds for them as fast as they could for new counties just being set up there. This included grants and leases on the Granville estate properties and adjacent to it in Granville and Orange Counties. The other group of new settlers came in at nearly the same time, or slightly before, from the border area of southeast Pennsylvania, Maryland and what is now Delaware and New Jersey (at one point split in ownership between Pennsylvania and New York). Exactly the same families have records in both areas and the northern area's records stop as the North Carolina records begin. The bunch that came from that border area started out mostly Quaker but did not stay Quaker as they migrated, or when they moved to North Carolina. They included: English, Anglo-Scots, and "Irish" who could have been Anglo-Irish or Anglo-Scots-Irish.

In Ireland the Quakers were persecuted under Cromwell, and later, and at one point a group from several counties including Sligo and Cavan went to the south to a place called **Mount Mellich/Mount Mellick**, then mostly emigrated to Pennsylvania soon after Penn founded the colony. The Quaker families at Mount Mellich/Mellick included families of English and Scottish origin and even a few "native Irish." The period of emigration for this group, to Pennsylvania and New Jersey, was generally 1693-1720.

The Wood families (there was more than one) mostly settled around Darby and Londongrove in Chester County and in Newcastle County. For a time, there were some also in New Jersey, but those mostly moved to Chester and Newcastle by the 1720's or so. There was also a small group of Wood families in Calvert and adjacent counties in Maryland in the late 1600's, probably Protestant, as by 1692, the Catholics lost control of the colony and soon afterward the new Protestant majority took away their right to vote and be seated in the colonial legislature for about 30 years.

There was a line of Wood families that descended from Henry Wood, from Scotland, who named his estate after his original family home, who became the first clerk of Orange County, VIRGINIA that is not included in this group of materials. His line stayed in Orange, Albemarle, Goochland and Rockingham counties in Virginia, past the time of the settlement of the North Carolina counties during, just before and just after, the French and Indian War. I had traced the line of Henry Wood of Orange County, VA

forward and while I see that some went to Kentucky eventually, none are recorded as having gone to North Carolina.

What I have consistently found is a particular group of families in Orange County, in a part that mostly later became Chatham County almost all came from PA/MD/DE before settling in North Carolina and they came with encouragement from the Chew and Lendrum/Landrum families after they intermarried. The Lendrum/Landrum were originally from Virginia but were in Albemarle-Goochland and intermarried with English families from PA, notably the Chew, who later were wealthy and famous Tories, for the most part in the Revolution. The Landrum/Lendrum family is originally Scottish and related to the Cummings clan, but was "Church of Scotland" and in Virginia associated with the English and Welsh, not the Presbyterian Scots in the Shenandoah Valley and westward. John Landrum with the help of the Chews went to London and was made the chief representative, "steward," of the Earl of Granville for the newly issued Granville estates in North Carolina, which included Granville, part of Perquimans and Orange Counties. Landrum appointed several other managers who were capricious in their leasing. This resulted in the "Regulators Rebellion" of 1773, in which some of Landrum's own sons participated, which split that family. To avoid being hung as rebels, at least three of Landrum's own sons ended up fleeing to South Carolina.

The group of families that came together from the PA/MD/DE family included: Landrum, Chew, Copeland, Dark and Wood--and there were SEVERAL Wood families, not all from one shire in England or Scotland. Some were from Yorkshire, and at least one line that settled in PA, and may have had descendants who went to North Carolina, was from Warwickshire. Some never were in Scotland, others originated in England, became Scottish citizens but then either Quaker or Church of Scotland willing to associate with Quakers. The one unifying key to this group seems to be that none were Presbyterians when they first settled and lived in North Carolina. Besides the family of Henry William Wood, was that of a John Wood who had come from PA through Newcastle (but was in Chester before that) to North Carolina in 1752, and changed his surname to Woods (possibly because he was on the Patriot side of the Revolution) who had sons William, Joseph (born in PA in 1750, and baptized in Newcastle in 1751, showing this family was changing its religion as it migrated southward) and Elihugh. He is intermarried with the Fawcett family--another PA Quaker family originally.

You will find that many of these families had Tory branches in the Revolution and many members of these families, but not all, ended up in Chatham County when it was split from Orange County. Granville County is where most of the first deeds for both Granville and Orange County were registered, but at least one deed from a group of records generally called "Granville County Deeds Records" is in Perquimans County. In looking for William Henry Wood's family, and others, researchers should check Granville and Chatham, as well as Orange County records. Pay attention to who the neighbors were across the 1750-1790 period. If you see the families who came from PA/MD/DE then you should look for earlier records in that area.

WOOD, Thomas, with Mary, his wife, and son William, came from Warwickshire, England, and settled in Chester County. A daughter was born at sea on the passage, and was named Richmonday. She married 3,31,1749, William Sheppard, of Menallen (now) Adams County.

William Wood, born in Warwickshire 6,22,1723, died 4,20,1775, married 10,6,1749, Margaret Holland, born 5,18,1730, in Price George Co., Md., died 10,29,1775, daughter of Thomas and Margaret Holland. They settled in Londongrove, and had children,--Thomas, m. Susanna Pusey; George; Mary, m. to Caleb Swayne; Joseph, Cassandra, William, Elizabeth, Margaret, m. to Garret Garretson; Joshua and Ruth.

Thomas and Susanna Wood were the parents of Joel, William, John, Lydia, Nathan, Margaret, Thomas, Susanna, Pusey, Caleb, and Mary. Of these, John married Lydia Swayne, and was the father of Thomas Wood, of Doe Run.

Joseph Wood, son of Thomas and Mary, died in 1797, aged sixty-seven years. He married, 1,12,1769, Katharine Day, and settled in West Nottingham. His children were Thomas, William, Joseph, Jesse, Lydia, Elizabeth, David, John and Day.

Dr. James Bayard Wood was born in New Castle Co., Del., Nov. 5, 1817. In 1920 his father, Joseph Wood, removed with his family to Londongrove township, Chester co. The educational advantages of Dr. Wood were only those afforded by the common schools of the day, but he neglected no opportunity to cultivate his mind and fit himself for usefulness in life.

He first learned the trade of a miller, which he followed about five years, and then engaged in the mercantile business in Chatham. On the election of William Rogers as sheriff, in the fall of 1840, he became his deputy, and held the position dur9ng his term and for a time thereafter. In October, 1844, he was elected sheriff, and held the office three years. In 1849 he engaged in merchandising in West Chester, and was also appointed postmaster. He held this office by appointment of the Postmaster-General and of the President until Mary, 1853. During this latter period he studied medicine, and graduated at the Homeopathic Medical College of Pennsylvania in March, 1854. Since that time he has devoted his attention almost exclusively to the practice of his profession, which is quite extensive, and in which he has been very successful. He has been honored with the position of president of the Chester County and State Homeopathic Medical Societies, and has been one of the censors of the national society. As a politician he has been active, and he has filled various posts of honor in the parties to which he belonged. He has served in the councils of the borough of West Chester, and since April, 1879, he has been chief burgess. Through his instrumentality and persevering efforts the present beautiful and enduring monument at the "Paoli massacre" grounds was erected in 1877. His wife is a daughter of William Rogers, and his only son, Dr. Henry C. Wood, is a physician in West Chester.
